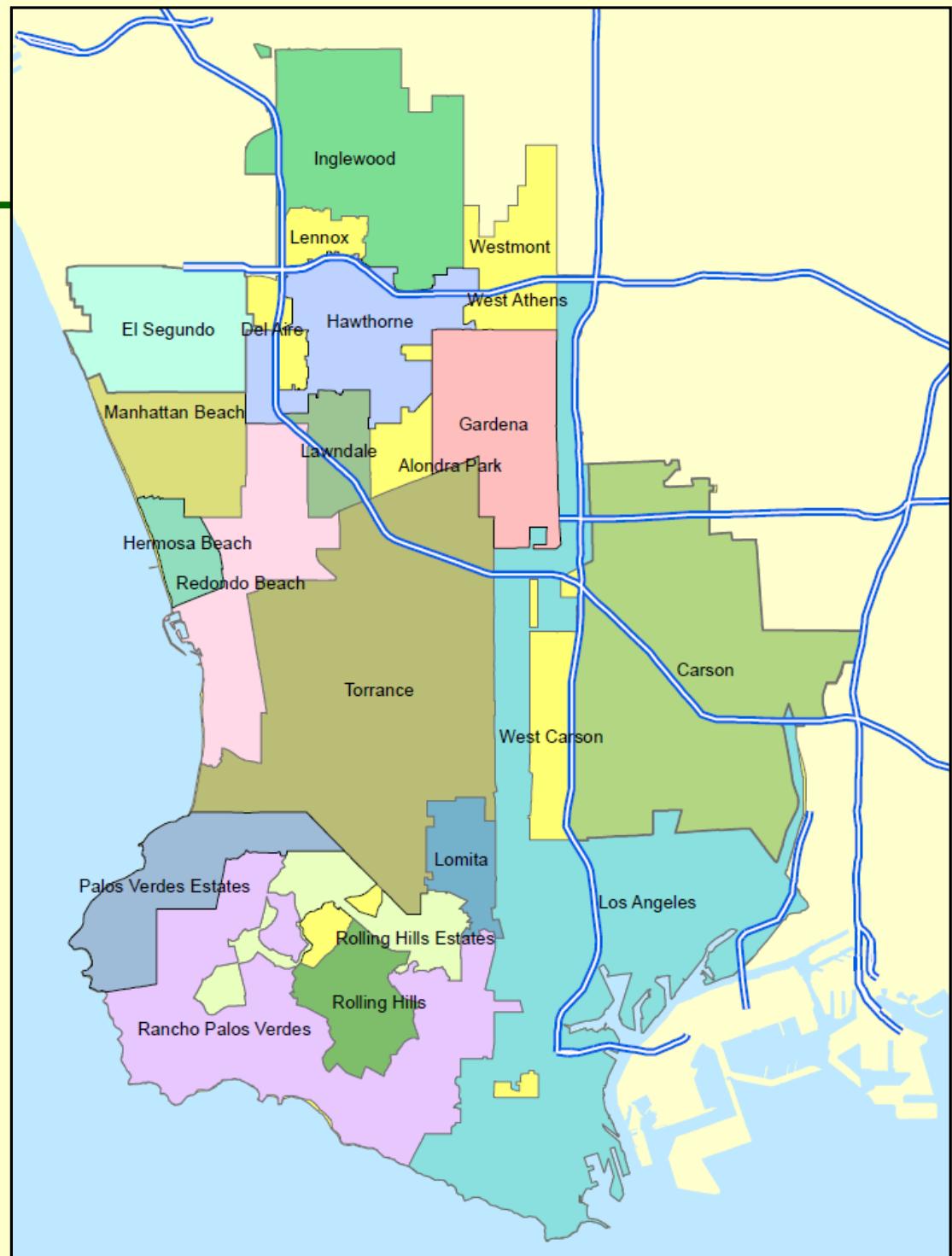

Homeless Services for the South Bay

- PATH Program Update: Supervisors Hahn and Ridley-Thomas have each committed \$200,000 to fund the South Bay homeless outreach program with PATH for FY 18-19. The contract amount is lower than the past 2 years due to some services, such as housing retention, being covered under Measure H. It is pending approval by the Board of Supervisors.
- Regional Coordination Update: Funding for SBCCOG and all Los Angeles County Councils of Governments to engage in regional homeless coordination will continue until Measure H sunsets – another 8 years. New program activities include assisting 6 South Bay cities in the implementation of homelessness plans which are currently under development and facilitating the creation of a regional homelessness plan.
- Other highlights: SBCCOG was part of the planning committee for a successful Housing and Health Fair in April that served 71 people experiencing homelessness. The next outreach event is planned for August in Harbor City. Other events being planned include trainings for First Responders and educational workshops for landlords to learn about incentives from the County for property owners who agree to rent to formerly homeless individuals and families.
