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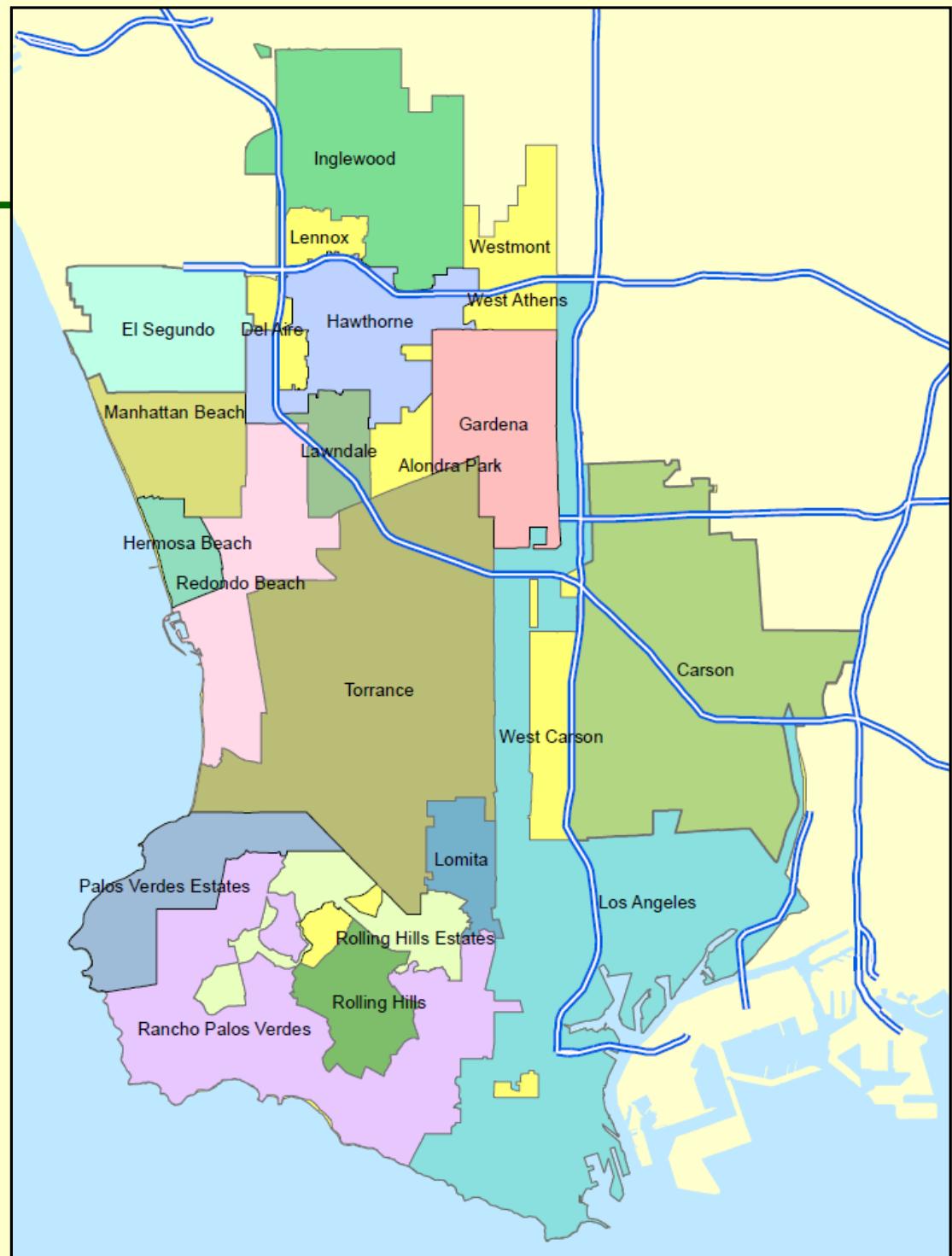

# Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

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- The SBCCOG has developed a Homeless Services in the South Bay webpage on the SBCCOG website: <http://southbaycities.org/programs/homeless-services-south-bay>
- The SBCCOG hosted a Technical Advisory session on the Cities' Homelessness Plan Implementation Grant RFP. 10 of our 15 cities attended. Six of the South Bay cities already developed homelessness plans. The next step is implementation of those plans. Cities that did not apply for the initial city plan funds can apply for funds through the Home for Good Funders Collaborative and/or collaborate on multi-jurisdictional proposals. A meeting to discuss collaboration is scheduled for the afternoon of October 11<sup>th</sup> for the Beach cities.
- SBCCOG Executive Director and a staff member visited the Safe Parking LA site in Koreatown. Currently there are 4 locations in the City of LA. The Koreatown site is at a church and had 15 cars/trucks/vans. All patrons must be registered with the program and are provided a parking permit. Plans are underway for another site in CD 15 at Temple Beth El in San Pedro.





# Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

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- There have been two “First Responders” trainings: 2/8/18 with 23 attendees and 9/6/18 with 20 attendees. Personnel from El Segundo, Gardena, Hermosa Beach, Inglewood, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach, and Torrance Police Departments have attended the trainings. Additionally, Santa Monica and Culver City Police Department personnel have been trained. Additional trainings are in process of being scheduled.
- SBCCOG was part of the planning committee for a successful Housing and Health Fair in August in Harbor City that served over 100 individuals and families experiencing homelessness. The next outreach event is planned for October 24 in Carson, and the SBCCOG has been successful in securing participation at the event from the Public Defender Criminal Record Clearing Project Mobile Unit and the DMV Mobile Unit.
- The 2018 Homeless Count saw a 22% increase in the number of older adults experiencing homelessness over last year. PATH will focus on becoming experts on senior issues. Cross training needs to occur between those providing services for older adults and those providing services for individuals experiencing homelessness.
- The City of Hawthorne will be holding a Senior Resource Fair on January 16, 2019 that will focus on resources and strategies to prevent homelessness. The SBCCOG is involved in the planning of the event.

# SBCCOG Recommendation to Metro

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## OPENING DAY

- C-3 Green Line South to Blue Line;  
Green Line/Crenshaw - Norwalk to Exposition Line
- Other improvements such as more Express bus service, traction power, & connections to LAX bus service

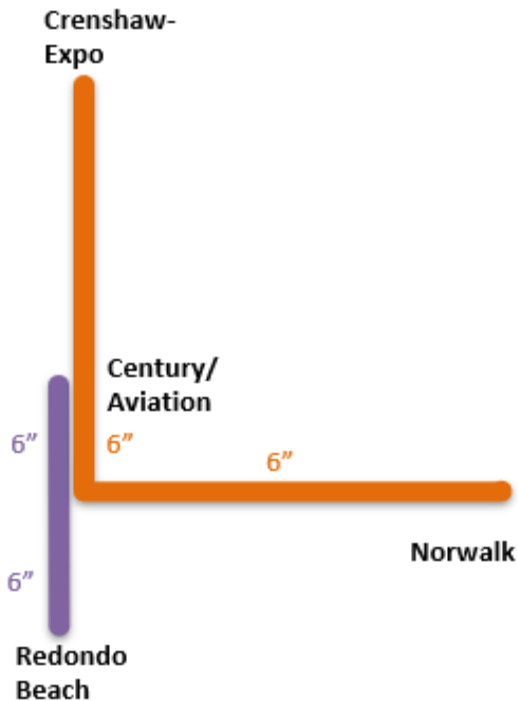
## LONGER TERM

- B-2 Green Line/Crenshaw – Norwalk to Exposition Line
- Other improvements to prepare for Green Line extension to Torrance



# Metro Staff Recommendation

Alt C-1: Crenshaw/Norwalk Interline  
with Redondo Shuttle



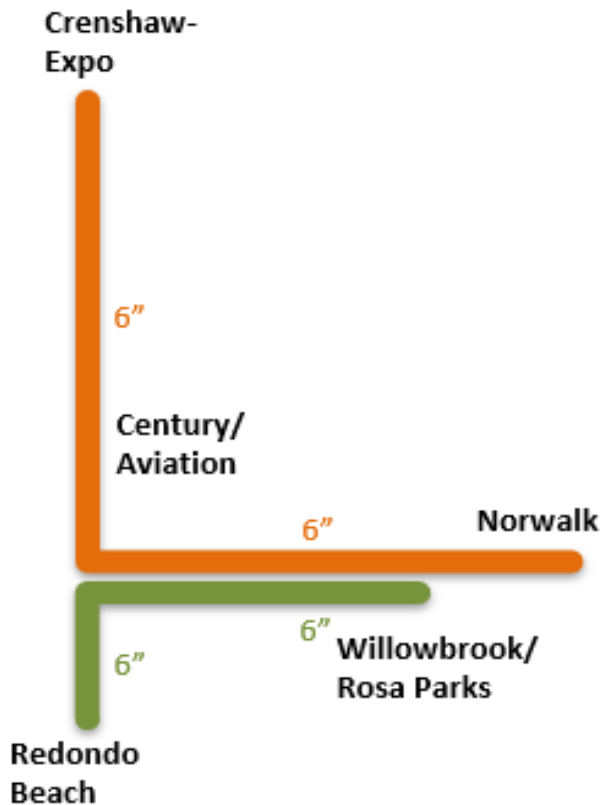
- **Peak service under this option:**
  - One-seat ride between Norwalk and Exposition; train every 6 minutes
  - One-seat ride from Century / Aviation Station to Redondo Beach Station; train every 6 minutes
- **Flaws:**
  - **Green Line South riders will need to transfer at Crenshaw-LAX Line's Century / Aviation station for trips either to Norwalk or the Exposition Line. The peak-hour transfer will add 3 minutes to Exposition and 7 minutes to the current Green Line between Norwalk and the South Bay**





# SBCCOG/Gateway COG Consensus Recommendation for Opening Day

Alt C-3: Green Line shortline, Crenshaw to Norwalk



## Peak service under this option:

- One-seat ride between Exposition and Norwalk; train every 6 minutes
- One-seat ride between Blue Line Rosa Parks Station and Redondo Beach every 6 minutes

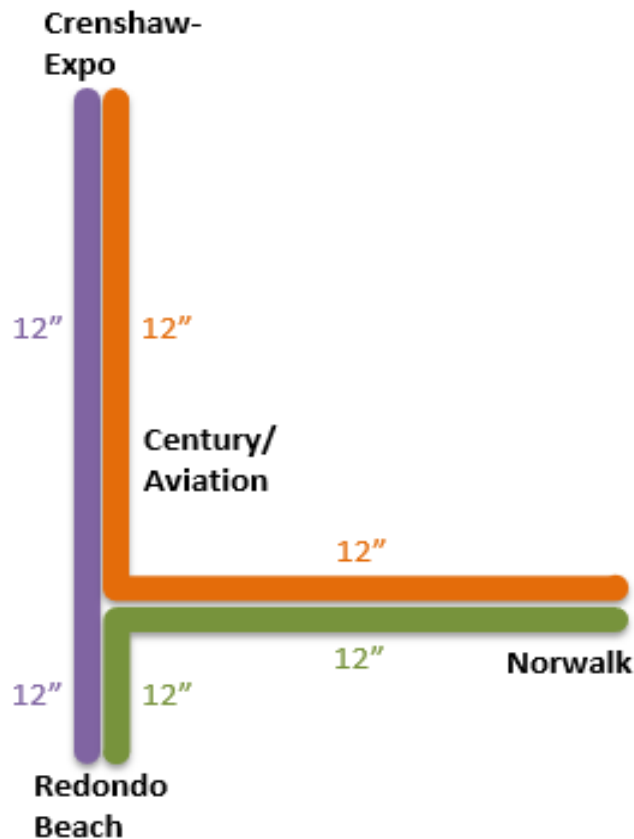
## Flaws:

- **Eliminates current Green Line one-seat ride between Norwalk and South Bay but retains connection to Blue Line and Silver Line.** Green Line Riders that board or alight east of the Blue Line will need to transfer to the Green Line to South Bay segment to travel to South Bay stations. South Bay riders travelling to the Green Line Norwalk station or to the Exposition line will need to transfer; 3-minute peak-period transfer delay in each case



# SBCCOG Recommendation Longer Term

Alt B-2: Crenshaw/Green  
Branch



## LONG TERM PREFERRED WITH NEEDED IMPROVEMENTS FURTHER ANALYSIS

### Peak Service under this option:

- One-seat ride between all three routes

### Flaws:

- **Peak Hour Green Line train frequency would be reduced from 6 minute headways to 12 minutes (maybe 10 minutes)**
- **Green Line would need three-car peak-hour trains and 5 South Bay station platforms would need to be expanded from 2-car platforms to 3-car platforms to prevent overcrowding**
