 - The GA was designed to kick off a continuing conversation with stakeholder about the challenges and opportunities facing the SB over the next 10 years. Using the SBCCOG website and GA facebook page we plan to pose questions perhaps once a month such as:
 - By decade of residence -- who moved or was born here in 50s, 60s, 70s, etc.
 For each decade, tell what you miss that isn't there anymore.
 - What destination have you walked to from home in the last 6 months? Do you always walk when you go there or do you drive sometime?
 - o If you had a magic wand, what routine (common frequent) destination would you make appear near your home so that you could walk all the time.
