

PROPOSED SBCCOG PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

This committee would focus on public safety issues, particularly those that affect South Bay cities and their residents. Included in the ambit of this committee would be the following:

Providing information regarding any proposed legislation, rules or regulations that would negatively or positively affect the safety of residents in the South Bay;

Recommending letters of support or opposition, when appropriate, regarding such proposed legislation, rules or regulations;

Coordinating SBCCOG public safety efforts and positions with those of the League of California Cities, California Contract Cities Association, other LA County COGS, public safety organizations and others in an effort to garner support for and assistance with SBCCOG public safety positions/efforts and thereby increase our collective influence;

Providing public safety tips, best practices and other helpful information that could be disseminated to South Bay residents either individually via SBCCOG delegates or collectively via SBCCOG website information and/or programs;

Exploring the use of our collective bargaining power to obtain group discounts for SBCCOG residents and/or businesses who wish to purchase public safety enhancing devices, such as security video camera systems, to enhance crime prevention and detection in our communities; and

Providing other services to SBCCOG delegates and their residents that would enhance public safety in the South Bay.
