To LCWG Members;

The September meeting will emphasize the working group part of the LCWG. We have several initiatives underway or about to begin. In some cases cities need to know what's coming so they can participate more effectively. In others, city guidance on some of the design decisions is needed.

The meeting will begin with Sabrina Bornstein's report on the status of the South Bay ESC's climate action planning and with the schedule for the coming months. The inventories have been completed and the initiative has moved into development of actual climate action plans for the participating cities. Sabrina will present a range of possible strategies for discussion.

As you know, SCAG received a grant from the CEC to support PEV readiness planning in the South Bay. The SBCCOG will be responsible for the municipal PEV readiness component of the sub-regional plan. The question is, how should we design that process?

One idea is to form a "task force" of city representatives. However, readiness will span a range of best practices that will include permit processing, inspection capabilities and practices, training programs, municipal fleet composition and more. Is there a single city representative who can address all the issues? We will discuss the options for assessing and developing PEV readiness at the meeting.

The same CEC grant will support several initiatives that will stimulate the market for PEVs. Economic development is one of the strategic areas being considered and I'd like the group to discuss and help evaluate specific options including economic impact, fiscal impact, real estate supply analysis, production chain analysis and used PEV sales.

I will also review what's happening with the Compass NOD project, the AQMD funded BEV Demonstration, the car2go car sharing project, and the UC Davis right sizing tool. RPV is managing the Western Ave. Visioning Project funded by SCAG under its Compass program and either Leza or I will briefly describe the goals.

This meeting will be held in our offices at 20285 Western Ave., Suite 100. Hope to see you there.
