Preparing for the Panama Canal Expansion

In February I joined a Congressional Delegation to Panama where I toured the Panama Canal Expansion Project. I observed first-hand the level of investment in preparing for the new Panamax ships. The transformation of the Panama Canal underscored the critical need to invest in our ports as well as our landside infrastructure in order to remain globally competitive in the 21st century. The next two years in Congress are crucial for investing in our transportation network and I am committed to getting important work done as part of the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee.



Passing the Civil Right Baton to the Next Generation

On March 7, 2015 my granddaughter McKenna and I joined my congressional colleagues and President Obama at the Edmund Pettus Bridge to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Bloody Sunday. The images of the brutality against peaceful protesters galvanized a national movement and the passage of the Voting Rights Act the following August.

As we remember the tipping point in the Civil Rights Movement we must not forget that the job is still not done. In 2013, the Supreme Court issued a ruling gutting the Voting Rights Act. In honor of the brave men and women who risked everything 50 years ago on this bridge, Congress must act to pass a revised and strengthened Voting Rights Act.
