SB 180 RISE Act #EquityandJustice	The Repeal Ineffective Sentencing Enhancement Act. Prohibits the use of sentence enhancements for non-violent drug offenses. Reintroduction of SB 966 (2016).	Signed into law
SB 190 Ending Juvenile Fees #EquityandJustice	Prohibits the assessment and collection of administrative fees against the families of youth in the juvenile justice system. Reintroduction of SB 941 (2016).	Signed into law
SB 213 Foster Placements	Reduces unnecessary delays in relative placements for children in foster care and expands the availability of placements by repealing redundant state criminal history restrictions and streamlining the process by which a prospective caregiver's criminal history is reviewed. Reintroduction of SB 1201 (2016).	Signed into law
SB 323 Community Clinics	Adds the Drug Medi-Cal Program (DMC) and county specialty mental health plan (SMHP) to the types of services for which federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) and rural health clinics (RHCs) can be reimbursed. Reintroduction of SB 1335 (2016).	Signed into law
SB 355 Court Fees #EquityandJustice	Prohibits courts from collecting fees for counsel and other legal assistance from defendants found innocent.	Signed into law
SB 393 Sealing of Arrests #EquityandJustice	Provides a clear legal pathway to sealing an arrest record from public view if the arrest did not result in a conviction, removing a serious barrier to employment and housing opportunities.	Signed into law
SB 394 LWOP #EquityandJustice	Brings California into compliance with the recent Montgomery U.S. Supreme Court ruling that held the mandatory sentences of life without the possibility of parole (LWOP) unconstitutional for individuals who were minors at the time of their criminal conviction.	Signed into law
SB 395 Miranda Rights #EquityandJustice	Requires youth 15 years of age and under to consult with legal counsel before they waive their constitutional rights.	Signed into law
SB 439 Minimum Age #EquityandJustice	Sets age 12 as the minimum age for youth to be placed in the jurisdiction of delinquency juvenile court.	2- year bill, signed into law 2018
SB 520 CalCPI	Creates an intervener program (the California Consumer Protection Initiative, CalCPI) at the CA Independent System Operator (CA ISO), ensuring consumers and the environment have advocates in the electricity rate setting process.	Failed in the Assembly
SB 612 Transitional Housing for Foster Youth	Builds on SB 12 of 2010, streamlining and augmenting the Transitional Housing Program for Foster Youth (THP+FC).	Signed into law
SCR 66 Bebe Moore Campbell Mental Health Month	Declares July 2017 as the Bebe Moore Campbell National Minority Mental Health Awareness Month	Passed
SR 30 Women and Girls in STEM	Supporting the increase in women and girls participating in science, technology, engineering and math careers by declaring April 2, 2017 to April 8, 2017 as Women and Girls in STEM Week	Passed

SR 31 Denim Day	Referencing a 1998 Italian Supreme Court ruling that found “because the victim wore very, very tight jeans, she had to help him remove them, and by removing the jeans it was no longer rape but consensual sex”, recognizes the month of April 2017 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month.	Passed
SR 54 African American Women's Equal Pay Day	Designates July 31, 2017 as African American Women's Equal Pay Day, a day to reflect on the progress made for African American women's pay, to examine current inequalities, and recognize the people in California working to ensure equality for all women, especially working African American women.	Passed
SR 65 PACE	Recognizes September 2017 as PACE month, honoring the CalPACE Association, which was formed in 2003 to support the development, expansion, success, and quality of the Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) who address the needs of the frail elderly and disabled adults ages 55 and older, a population which is growing rapidly and whose impact on health care costs is significant	Passed

SB 439 Minimum Age <i>#EquityAndJustice</i>	Sets 12 as the minimum age for youth to be placed in the jurisdiction of delinquency juvenile court.	Signed into law
SB 951/SB 871 Film Tax Credit	Reauthorizes the Film Tax Credit, ensuring thousands of behind the screen jobs stay in CA. SB 871 is the budget bill that implemented the provisions of SB 951.	Approved through the budget
SB 982/AB 1811 CalWORKs	Addresses childhood deep poverty by raising the CalWORKs family grant. AB 1811 is the budget bill that implemented the intent of SB 982, as well as other human services budget issues.	Approved through the budget
SB 1034 Dense Breast Tissue	Holds the line on continuing earlier detection of breast cancer by eliminating the sunset on the current dense breast tissue notification, which is set to expire 1/2019.	Signed into law
SB 1050 Exonerees <i>#EquityAndJustice</i>	Provides services and support for exonerated people after prison including healthcare, vocational training and updating exoneree records to reflect their wrongful convictions.	Signed into law
SB 1083 Resource Family Approval	Addresses hurdles in the Resource Family Approval (RFA) process so that it is more supportive of caregivers and youth in foster care.	Signed into law
SB 1343 Sexual Harassment Training	Expands the current sexual harassment training requirements to all employees, for employers with 5 or more employees.	Signed into law
SB 1391 Youth tried as Adults <i>#EquityAndJustice</i>	Ensures that youth ages 14 and 15 who commit crimes get the services and help they need by prohibiting them from being tried as adults and keeping them in the juvenile justice system.	Signed into law
SB 1392 RISE Act 2018 1-year Sentence enhancement <i>#EquityandJustice</i>	Eliminates the 1-year sentence enhancement for felony convictions. Failed on the Senate floor.	Failed in the Senate
SB 1393 5-year Judicial Discretion <i>#EquityAndJustice</i>	Continues fair and just sentencing reform by returning to prior statutory authority for judicial discretion on the mandatory 5-year enhancements for each serious felony conviction.	Signed into law
SR 78 Rosa Parks	Honors February 4, 2018 as the 105th birthday of Rosa Parks and urges all Californians to remember this great American woman.	Passed
SR 81 Women and Girls in STEM	Declares February 11, 2018, as Women and Girls in Science Day in California.	Passed
SCR 55 Bebe Moore Campbell Mental Health Month	Declares July 2017 as the Bebe Moore Campbell National Minority Mental Health Awareness Month	Passed
