COVID-19 Vaccine Update

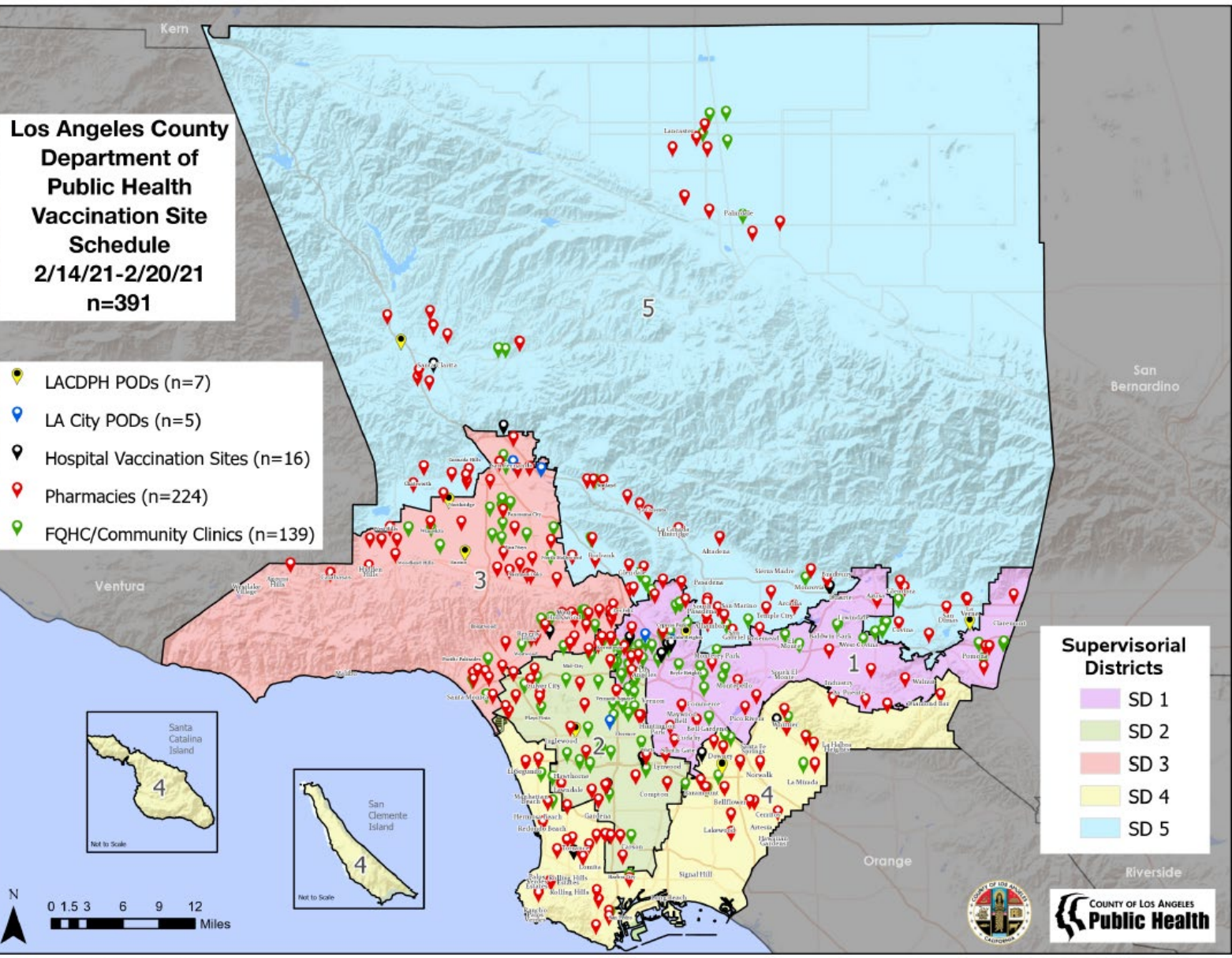
- 1,770,505 Total Doses Administered

 - 15.5% of LA County (age 16+) have received 1 dose
 - 6.0% of LA County (age 16+) is fully vaccinated

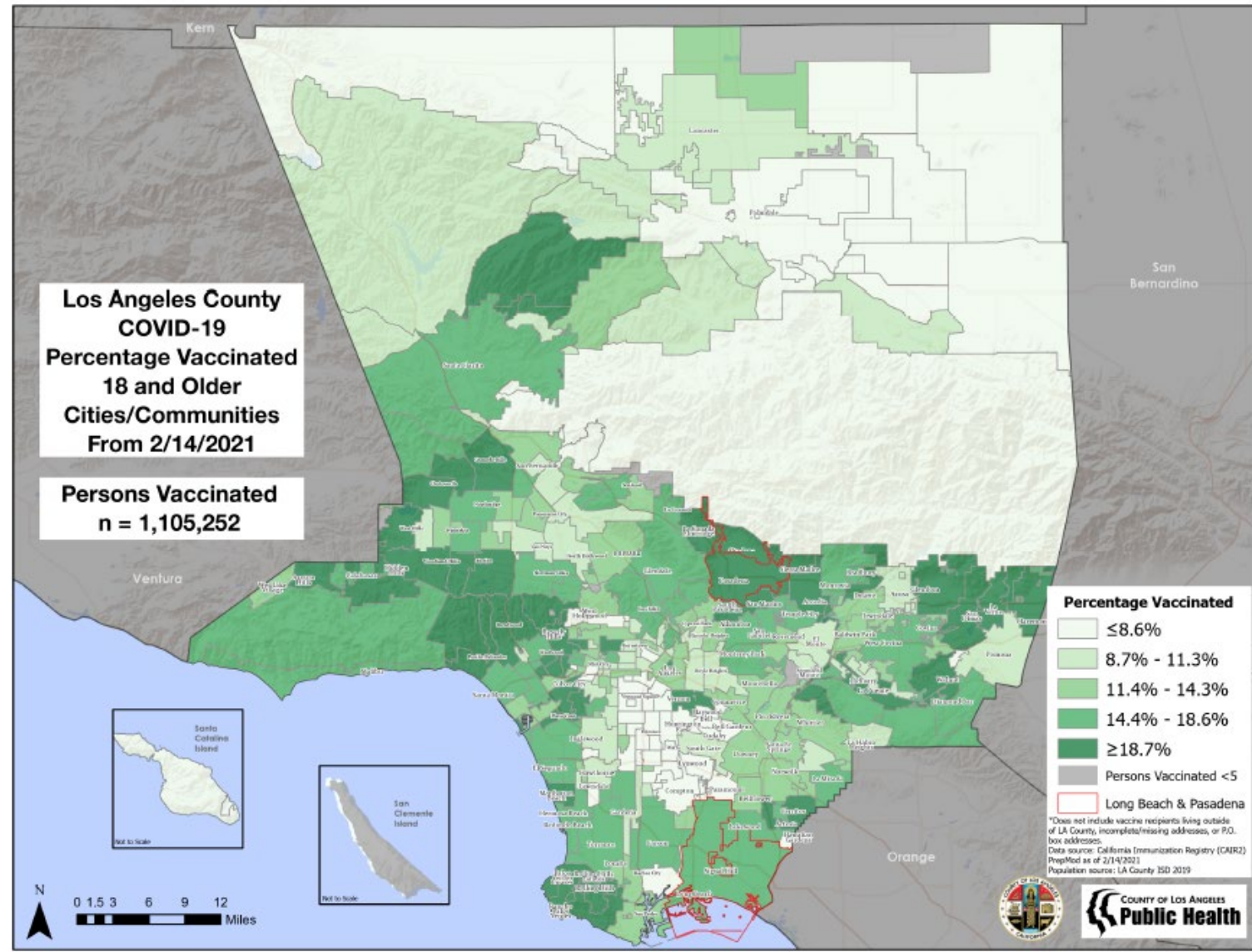

Measures to Address Vaccine Coverage Inequities

- Prioritizing new vaccination sites in communities with the lowest vaccination coverage rates
- Expansion of mobile vaccination units to seniors and others who have limited mobility
- Expansion of transportation support services to those who are unable to travel to a vaccination site
- Community outreach with information in multiple languages on available vaccination services

New Tiers Opening March 1st

- Vaccine Eligibility will include groups in phase 1b, tier 1
 - Education/childcare
 - Emergency services and Public safety
 - Food and Agriculture sectors
- These newly eligible groups include approximately 1.2 million additional county residents
