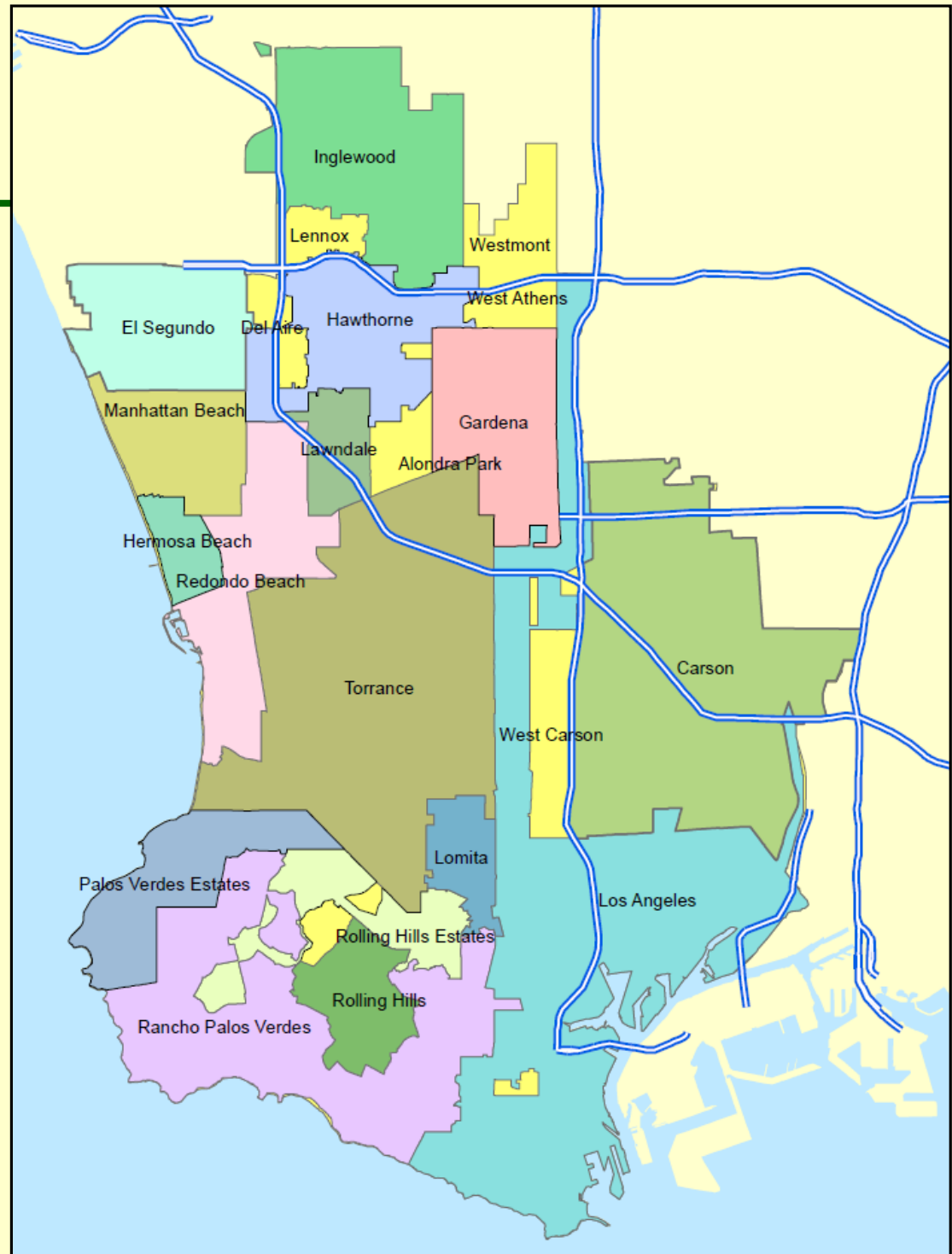

Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

- More affordable housing is needed through the South Bay region! Desperate need of Interim/Emergency housing!
- The most recent Housing & Health Resources Fair was held May 29th in San Pedro. For the first time, mobile showers were available for the attendees, with 23 taking showers. SBCCOG partner, Water Replenishment District (WRD), donated 10 cases of water bottles for the event.
- SBCCOG is working with Supervisor Hahn's staff to bring mobile showers to the South Bay on a monthly basis.
- SBCCOG Executive Director and Homeless Services Coordinator participated in a site visit at the Access Center in Santa Monica, operated by The People Concern. The Access Center serves as a safe space open daily and is the point of entry for program participants. Services include showers, laundry, lockers, daily sack lunches, medical care, case management, art therapy, movies, mail and message service, housing referrals. Over 200 people are served daily.



Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

- The 2019 Homeless Count numbers were released in June, with the South Bay experiencing a 6% increase. City and community specific data is expected to be released by July 15th.
- The SBCCOG Homeless Services Task Force met yesterday. The meeting showcased the Beach Cities (Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, and Redondo Beach) and the City of Inglewood that were awarded implementation grant funding from the LA County Homeless Initiative. In the Beach Cities, the funds will be used for a Homeless Services Coordinator/City Liaison and Homeless Case Managers. In Inglewood, the funds will be used for a Homeless Services Coordinator.
- The next Homeless Services Task Force meeting is scheduled for Sept. 4th.
- The SBCCOG hosts Assembly Member Muratsuchi's Homeless Action Group meetings.

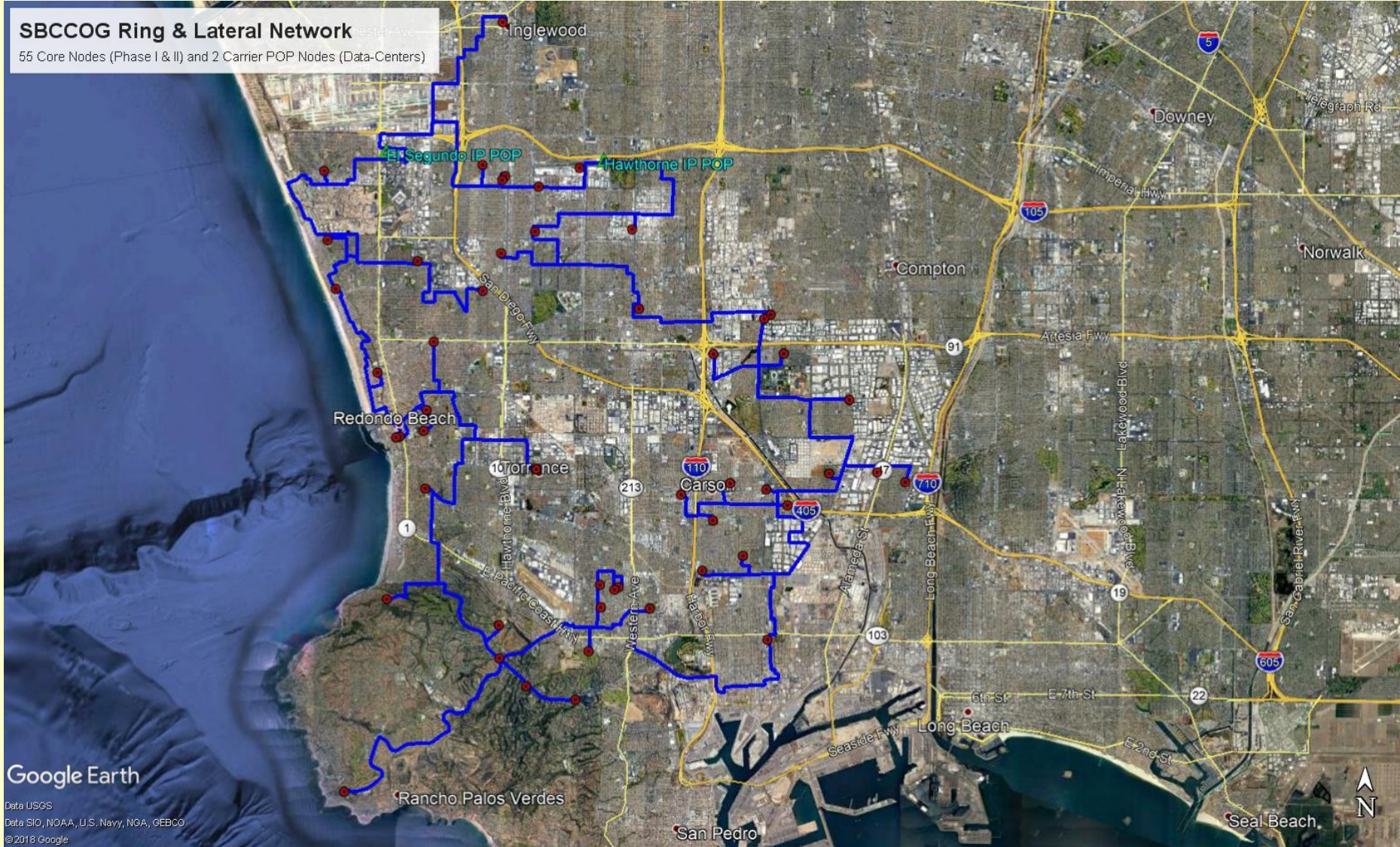
South Bay Fiber Network

- Developed through competitive bid
successful bidder is American Dark Fiber
- Participating agencies: all 15 cities, BCHD, LABioMed, SBWIB, LA Metro, LA County DPW
- All capital costs for Phase 1 participants funded by SBCCOG's Measure M Subregional Funds
- Minimum service - \$1000/mo for 1 gigabit.
- All agencies will be connected to real time traffic information

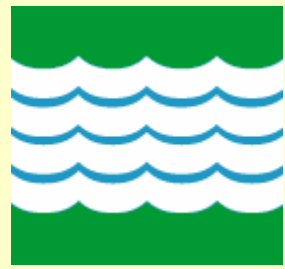


South Bay Fiber Network
