

## **Dowell Myers**

Dowell Myers is a professor of policy, planning, and demography in the Sol Price School of Public Policy at the University of Southern California, where he also directs the USC Population Dynamics Research Group. Professor Myers is a scholar who integrates demography with housing, real estate, sustainability, labor force, voting and other issues central to urban planning and policy. Myers also is known for championing the mutual benefits approach for gaining agreement about diversity and population change, and he advocates a future orientation as the focus of planning. He and John Pitkin have prepared a series of generational futures projections for California, tracking not only age, sex and race, but also immigrants and the native-born, and in particular the California born. Myers is a member of the National Academy of Sciences panel on the economic and fiscal impacts of immigration. Myers serves as associate editor of the *Journal of the American Planning Association*, and he is the author of the award-winning book *Immigrants and Boomers: Forging a New Social Contract for the Future of America*. Professor Myers holds his PhD in Urban and Regional Planning from MIT (with work in demography conducted at Harvard University), a Master of City Planning from UC-Berkeley, and a BA in anthropology from Columbia University.
