Reason to Serve:

I would like to be considered to represent our SBCCOG on the CAL Cities LA Division Board of Directors because I believe that my background and years of experience would be beneficial at this time to the LA Division, as well as our South Bay Council. This is a crucial time in our ongoing efforts to retain vital local control for our municipalities, as we see the State increasingly encroaching on our ability to serve the interests and needs of our constituents. Having served on Cal Cities committees and on the State Board of Directors, my years of service and experience with Cal Cities will position me to offer strategic input as we seek to increase our influence in decision-making at the State level. Brief Bio: Britt Huff, Mayor Pro Tem

Britt Huff was elected to the Rolling Hills Estates city council in 2013, and re-elected in 2018 while serving as Mayor, and again in 2022. She has also represented her city in regional organizations, including Contract cities, Cal Cities, SCAG, and SBCCOG, where she was Chair of the Board of Directors. Prior to her election she served on the Planning Commission for five years, and as Chair in 2012. She holds a Ph. D. in Political Science/Public Administration from George Washington University in Washington, D.C., a B.A. from UCLA, and graduate certificates from The American University and Georgetown University. She has also been a political science professor on the adjunct faculties of USC, Westmont College in Santa Barbara, and Marymount University in Palos Verdes. Britt began her career in Washington, D.C. working on Capitol Hill as a business/legislative assistant. She subsequently was accepted into the diplomatic corps as a Foreign Service Officer with the U.S. Dept. of State. She later served as the Deputy Director of the Boston District office of the U.S. Commerce Dept., and as a New England Regional Manager for the U.S. Energy Department in Boston. She transitioned to non-profit management and consulting in Southern California, currently working as Director of a non-profit.
