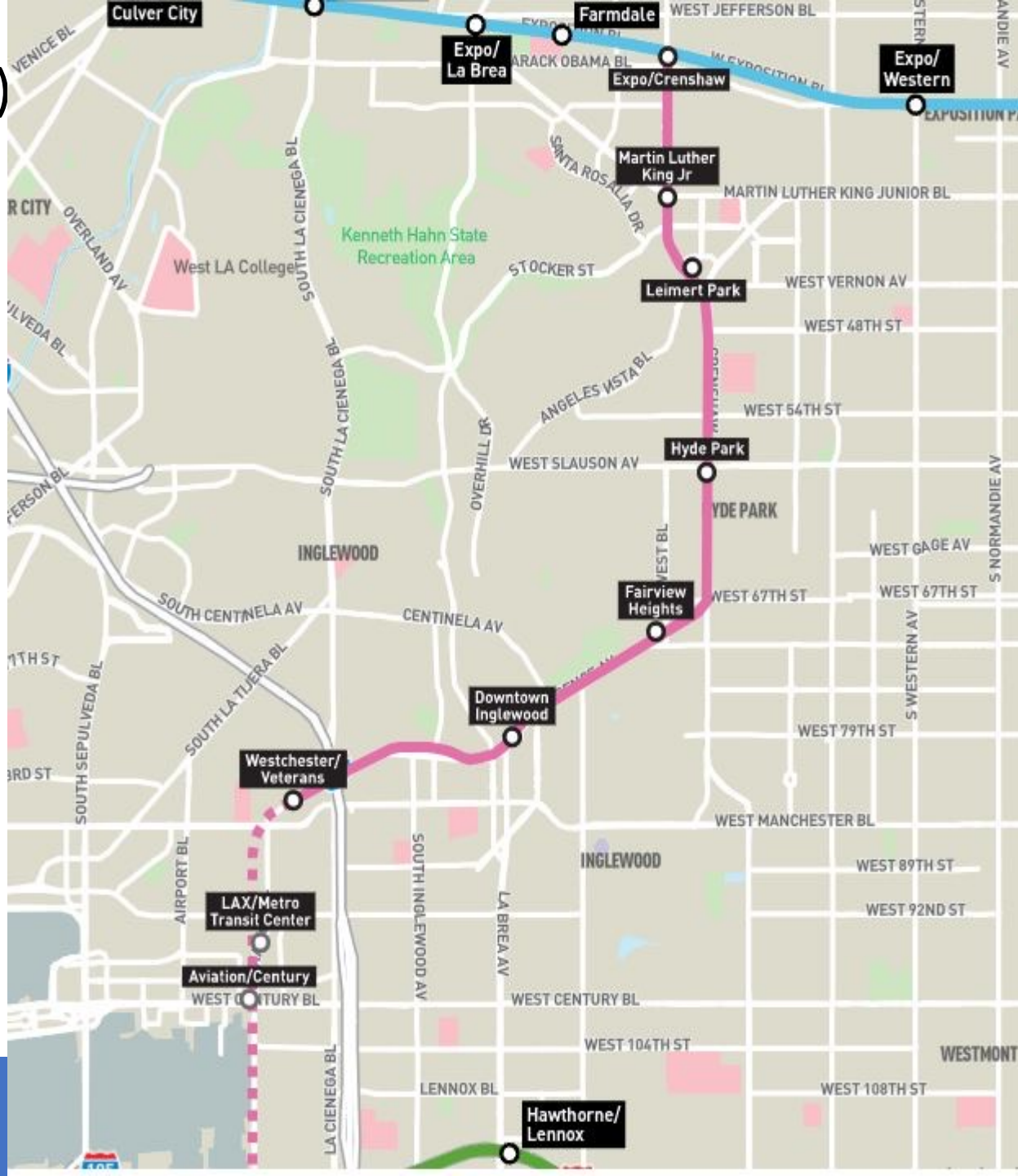

# K Line (Crenshaw/LAX) Opening October 7<sup>th</sup>

The line will open after a noontime opening ceremony on Friday, October 7<sup>th</sup> between the Exposition Line and the Westchester/Veterans station.

The LAX station and Aviation/Imperial C Line (Green) connection will open in 2024.

Metro is offering free rides throughout the Metro bus and rail system October 7<sup>th</sup> – October 9<sup>th</sup>



# Uplifting Arts, Culture, and Recreation During the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games

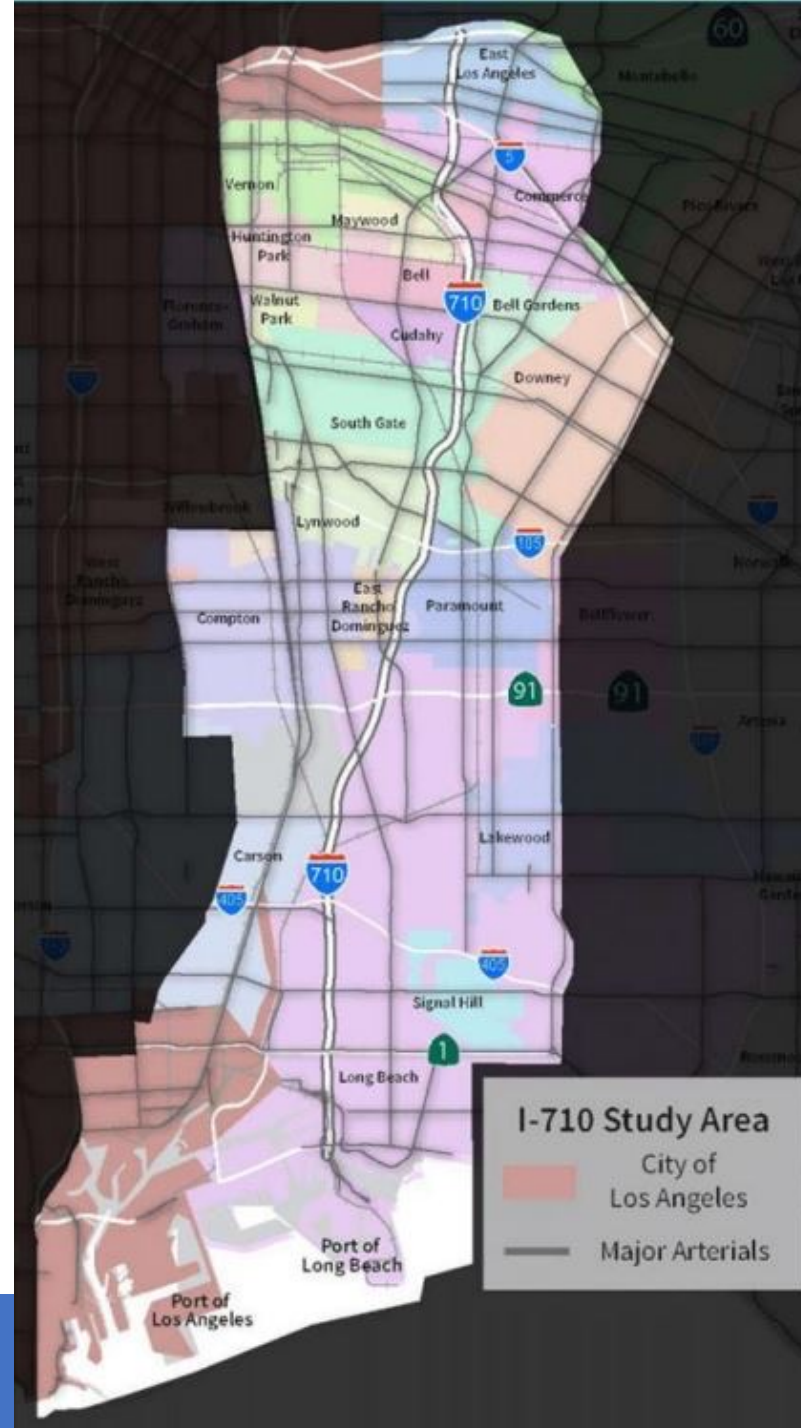
Metro will be launching a special grant program dedicated to transforming streets and transportation facilities into temporary centers of art, culture, and recreation for the 2028 Olympics.

This is an expansion of the 1984 mural program.



# I-710 South Corridor Task Force

- Approved a vision statement and guiding principles/goals
- New project name: “The Long Beach-East LA Corridor Mobility Investment Plan”
- Will be submitting 4 project grant applications to the state for funding
- POLA is not included in the new program



# Fare Capping Update

- The Board heard a report on a proposed simplified fare structure. The new structure will include a base fare of \$1.75, with a rider's daily fare capped at 3x that. There will be a similar weekly and monthly cap process.
- In order to implement this change, a fare policy change must be adopted along with updates to the TAP system.
- Some Metro Board members were concerned that this would impact transfers on the system.
- Staff will report back in December with a request to adopt the new fare policy and would subsequently coordinate with the TAP partners to ask them to adopt the same policy.

# Measure M Multi-Year Subregional Program & Measure R Transit Investment Program Updates

- The Metro Board approved the South Bay's project lists for Measure M MSPs and Measure R SBTIP consistent with the SBCCOG's recommendations earlier in the year.
  - \$12.3 million in Measure M TSMIP 1
  - \$23.2 million in Measure M HOIP
  - \$6.4 million in Measure M TSMIP 2
  - \$4 million in Measure R SBTIP
- Project lead agencies can now begin working with Metro staff to execute funding agreements for projects with funding programmed for FY22-23.
- SBCCOG will be holding one-on-one meetings with city staff in the coming weeks to review existing projects and new project requests
- SBCCOG staff is scheduling one-on-one meetings with South Bay Lead Agencies to start the FY 23-24 Metro Budget Request process that updates current project funding needs and evaluates new project proposals.
