

SBCCOG Meeting3/3/22

1. **Interim Housing (Shelter) Updates**
 - i. San Pedro Interim Housing – 1 vacancy / 23 Permanent housing placements (3 in the past week/3 more pending) 87% of the residents are fully vaccinated.
 - ii. San Pedro ABH – 16 Vacancies / 20 Permanent housing placements / 67% of the residents are fully vaccinated.
 - iii. Redondo Beach Pallet Shelter – No vacancies / 23 Permanent housing placements
 - iv. Completing Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) applications at all sites. 62 completed to date. 40 vouchers in hand

2. **CES Goal Attainment (Individuals) 7/1/2021-06/30/2022**
 - a. Number of individuals assessed -- 173
 - b. Number of households housed through RRH & Recovery Rehousing– 45
 - c. Number of chronically homeless single adults placed via HN – 31
 - d. Number of permanent housing placements – Torrance Housing Navigation – 13
 - e. Number of permanent housing placements – Redondo Beach HN - 6

3. **CES Goal Attainment (TAY) 7/1/2021-06/30/2022**
 - a. Number of households assessed – 11
 - b. Number of households housed in RRH - 9
 - c. Number of households who have retained housing through Prevention – 0 have not had any referrals – 2 problem solving cases retained housing with light financial assistance.

4. **CES Goal Attainment (Families) 7/1/2021-06/30/2022**
 - a. Number of Households assessed: 148
 - b. Number of households housed in RRH: 63
 - c. Number of households who have retained housing through Prevention: 13
 - d. Family System is also working with LB Housing Authority and has been able to connect 49 families to EHV S-8 and they have another 51 vouchers for families that are homeless in Long Beach.

Success Story: Danny had been homeless for 14 years in San Pedro, as well as his sister and brother, who unfortunately passed away 2 years ago in an encampment. Danny was there that day and it was then, that he decided that he no longer wanted to live on the streets. He entered 8th Street Interim Housing in March 2020. Since being at the site he obtained GR benefits, accessed services at DMH and has both health benefits and a primary care physician. All of these accomplishments may not seem lofty, but for Danny it set him on a pathway to self-sufficiency. He applied for an Emergency Housing Voucher and on January 25th he got the keys to his new apartment. We were also able to secure a welcome home kit from a local church that included new pots & pans, dishes, cleaning supplies, laundry detergent, comforter/bedding and furniture for his new home. Danny is shy, however on the day that he picked up his welcome home kit he commented that he was grateful for all the help he received and a start at a new life.
