- On page 3, the RFP is revised to: "The consultant shall collect and analyze robust sets of information to identify and map as a GIS layer the location of ADUs in the eight (8) participating South Bay cities."
- On page 3, the RFP is revised to: "GIS layer of ADUs in the eight (8) participating cities"
- On page 3, the RFP is revised to: "The consultant shall collect housing policies that could affect ADU development from each of the **eight (8)** participating cities."
- On page 5, the RFP is revised to: "Memorandum with an analysis of the eight (8) participating cities' conditions and capacity on water supply and its distribution system, sewer infrastructure, solid waste disposal, parks per capita, budget constraints, and mobility systems to ensure sustainability, to understand the conditions and capacity that could impact ADU development at scale that will address local RHNA requirements, and to understand if ADU development encumbers carrying capacity"
- On page 5, the RFP is revised to: "Compare the number of ADUs built by year and rate of growth to the RHNA allocation for each of the eight (8) participating cities"
