5. **CES Success Story**

Ms. Hernandez was previously homeless, elderly, and living in her vehicle in San Pedro. Ms. Hernandez previously lived with her family, but due to some family disagreements, the decision for her to live in her vehicle was her last option.

Ms. Hernandez stayed in her inoperable vehicle for a about 2 years before coming to Harbor Interfaith Services Access Center, where she was able to complete a vulnerability assessment and received case management, that would eventually lead to being matched to a Project Based Housing in SPA 8, called Athens Vistas.

Thanks to SBCCOG, her security deposit was paid for, this allowed Ms. Hernandez to focus on reacclimating to permanent housing, where Ms. Hernandez says she can “rest peacefully for the rest of her days.”
