Area G Disaster Management Area is composed of fourteen south bay cities: El Segundo, Gardena, Hawthorne, Hermosa Beach, Inglewood, Lawndale, Lomita, Manhattan Beach, Palos Verdes Estates, Rancho Palos Verdes, Redondo Beach, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, and Torrance. As an area, the cities work together on planning efforts, preparedness campaigns, alert and warning through Alert South Bay and much more. In addition to planning, mitigation and preparedness efforts, the cities quickly and effectively transition to response and recovery efforts during emergencies. Each city has many accomplishments and activities that have been conducted during the quarter. This report will only highlight a few of the larger area-wide activities and responses that were conducted during the quarter.

Non-Emergency

1. Hosted CSTI Emergency Management Instructor Course training to certify 25 new emergency management instructors including two Area G emergency services coordinators.
2. Promoted National Disaster Preparedness month's "Take Control 1, 2, 3" campaign. The campaign focused on preparing older adults for disasters.
3. Prepared for the Great Shakeout scheduled for October 19, 2023, at 10:19 a.m. The Area G cities are participating in a variety of capacities including evacuation drills, communications drills, sharing of preparedness materials and more.

Emergency Responses

1. Rolling Hills Estates Land movement: Rolling Hills Estates has been assisting those impacted by the land movement in the community.
2. Hurricane/Tropical Storm Hilary Response: Area G cities prepared and distributed sandbags and preparedness information to the community leading up to the storm. Many of the cities activated their emergency operations centers to assist with their storm response.
